

## Reception set for Judge Abrams

A retirement reception for Judge Robert Abrams has been planned for Thursday, Sept. 26 from 4-6 p.m. at All Saints Episcopal Church of Heppner. Judge Abrams has submitted his resignation as circuit court judge to Governor John Kitzhaber, effective Aug. 31. Abrams said in a letter of resignation Aug. 23 that he had hoped to complete his second

full term as circuit court judge of the Sixth Judicial District, but, because of a "disabling stroke" on July 30, 1995, he was unable to carry out his duties.

Abrams and his wife, Marion, lived around 29 years in Heppner where he was Morrow County District Attorney and also had a private law practice. The couple have five grown children.

The Morrow County Court will hold a public hearing at 10:00 o'clock a.m. on Wednesday, September 18, 1996, at 206 Main St. N, Boardman, Oregon to hear public comment upon annexation of territory to the Fuller Canyon Livestock District. The territory included therein is generally situated southwest of the City of Lexington. The boundaries of the proposed district are as follows:
