BONDS FOR FIREFIGHTING

QUESTION: Shall Boardman Rural Fire Protection District Be Authorized to issue \$190,000 of bonds for a fire truck and related equipment?

SUMMARY: The District seeks authority to issue general obligation bonds to purchase a fire truck and related equipment.

The bonds will mature over a term not exceeding 10 years.

If bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limitations of Section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Approval of this measure would not reduce the property tax collections of other taxing authorities.

The territory included therein is generally situated southwest of the City of Lexington. The boundaries of the proposed district are as follows:
