### "No" votes wanted

To the Editor:  
To everyone who has contributed to Oregon Agriculture Education PAC's campaign to defeat Measure 38, the "Clean Stream Initiative"—your time, money and your "no" votes in November will help defeat this very detrimental and costly measure.

Radio ads will begin to air this week primarily in the Portland Metro area and Willamette Valley, letting voters know that "Measure 38 will incite conflict rather than cooperation, and that the lawsuit provisions in the proposed measure are unfair."

So far \$330,000 has been raised with the help of 120 county coordinators and the Agriculture Alliance, which consists of Oregon Cattlemen's Association, Oregon Farm Bureau, Oregon Lands Coalition, Oregon State Grange, Oregon Dairy Farmers Association, Oregonians for Food and Shelter, Water for Life, and

others. Another \$220,000 is needed to carry out the ongoing campaign. Each county has a goal of \$15,000 to raise and Morrow County has raised almost \$12,000.

Lindsay Slater, director of Oregon Cattlemen's Legal Center in Salem has said, "With education, we can beat this, as long as we have the resources." Please keep those contributions coming in to help defeat this measure. We'd like to add your name to the growing list of concerned contributors in Morrow County.

### MCCCF awards local grants

The Morrow County Commission on Children and Families (MCCCF) has approved four Community Development Grants.

Boardman was given a grant for \$500 to assist with the cost of building a playground in the Sunridge area. An award of \$500 was given to Umatilla-Morrow County Head Start, Inc. for child care providers education and nutrition workshops. Five hundred dollars was also granted to Sarah Carlson to provide MathStart and Hands On Science lessons to Morrow County preschoolers. Georgia Rathbun was awarded \$220 to purchase some playground equipment for her child care and foster

care business.

"All of these projects will enhance the quality of life for children in Morrow County," said Dar Merrill, MCCCF director.

Additional funds will be available in December and will be used to leverage other funds into services, advocacy and application projects for the children, youth and families of Morrow County, said Merrill. The maximum grant awarded is \$500 and requires a 1/3 match in other resources. The grants will be awarded on Dec. 10 and must be received by the Children and Families Dept. no later than Nov. 20 to be considered.
