Jepsen supports Gordon Smith

Heppner Mayor Bob Jepsen has announced his support to elect Gordon Smith for U.S. Senate.

Prevent insect damage

When temperatures begin dropping in the fall, many types of small insects begin finding their way into Oregon homes. Insects come in through open doors, windows or on firewood and other objects carried inside.

Be concerned about pests that can damage furnishings, clothing, or foodstuffs. Those that damage clothing and household furnishings include earwigs, sow bugs and pillbugs, carpet beetles, silverfish, firebrats, and clothes moths.

Insects that contaminate foodstuffs include ants, cockroaches, bran bugs, and meal moths.

Non-damaging nuisance insects that migrate indoors to overwinter include spiders, centipedes, millipedes, and box elder bugs. Grease bugs, also known as "grass" or "home-stead" bugs, are a nuisance, but do not damage food or household goods.

The key to controlling these unwanted visitors is sanitizing. If you suspect your firewood contains insects, leave the wood outdoors until burned.

A vacuum cleaning under furnishings, along the base of walls, in corners, at the edge of the ceiling, and in window and door sills, will help control many insects in the home.

Control of pests that infest foodstuffs is similar. Keep all cereal products in glass or metal containers with tight fitting lids. Keep food storage and preparation areas clean.

Spilled foodstuffs provide a ready source of food for insect pests. Don't forget to clean under and around the stove and refrigerator. Remove drawer and shelf paper and vacuum crumbs. Discard the old paper and replace with new. Put large amounts of flour, cereal products, dried fruits, or dry pet foods in metal containers with tight-fitting lids. The original containers in which most food materials are purchased, including pet food, are usually not sufficient protection to prevent an infestation of insect pest.

The BLM is seeking input on a proposed land exchange involving more than 75,000 acres of isolated, BLM-administered land in 6 counties. The land exchange will occur in Baker, Union, Umatilla, Morrow, Grant, and Wheeler counties in two phases. In Phase I, in exchange for BLM tracts the United States would acquire a block of land along the North Fork of the John Day River which straddles the Grant, Morrow and Umatilla county lines. It will adjoin a second piece of land that is located west of the North Fork and includes Ditch and Cabin Creeks drainage on the East, Wall Creek drainage on the West and abuts the Umatilla National Forest to the North. In Phase II, additional lands will be acquired in Baker and Grant counties. Specific locations will be determined later.

This is an "assembled" exchange involving many different parties including both Vale and Prineville BLM Districts. To facilitate this process, the BLM is working with Clearwater Land Exchange. The purpose of this exchange is to consolidate BLM administered land and allow for more efficient management and greater public access.

Although the proposal has not yet been formally announced in the Federal Register, the N.E. Oregon Assembled Land Exchange analysis team has started public scoping, in preparation for writing an Environmental Impact Statement. The Prineville District's Two Rivers (1986) and John Day (1985, 1995) Resource Management Plans and the Vale District's Baker (1989, 1992) Resource Management Plan (RMPs) currently provide general management for land tenure adjustments as well as overall land and resource use allocations and resource protection or enhancement. Although it is anticipated that the final decisions for land exchanges considered through this analysis will be in full conformance with the applicable RMPs, it is possible that portions of some actions under some alternatives may require plan amendments. Public meetings concerning this proposal were held in John Day, Baker City, LaGrande, Heppner, and Pendleton this summer. To gather additional comments and information from the public at large, BLM staff are offering a public tour on October 15 and 16, 1996, of lands considered for acquisition and disposal.

This tour will give interested groups, agencies, or individuals opportunity to discuss the proposal with BLM staff while visiting acquisition/disposal land parcels on sight. Because of the remote nature of many tracts involved, only a portion of the proposal areas will be included in the tour route, which will be determined by BLM staff.

On October 15, the tour will focus on acquisition tracts along the North Fork John Day River from Camas Creek to Potamus Creek, and scattered disposal tracts in Umatilla County. On October 16, the tour will visit acquisition areas including portions of the Wall, Little Wall, Ditch and Cabin Creek drainage, and disposal tracts near Monument, Oregon.

The October 15 tour will leave at 9:30 a.m. from the Ukiah City Park, and the Oct. 16 tour will leave at 9:00 am from the River Access Recreation Site, in Monument, Oregon. Tours will end at 4:00 p.m. each day at start location.

Bring lunch and drinking water for each day. We look forward to your attendance.
