The Ione Lady Cardinals kicked off the Wasco County Tournament in Maupin, Friday, Dec. 20, with a victory over the Sherman County Huskies, 43-35.

The game started off quickly, with Sherman answering each lone shot with two of their own. The score at the end of the first quarter was lone, six, Sherman County, 12.

Ione's quick-paced basketball soon overtook the Huskies, however, and the Cardinals passed Sherman on the board as well as the floor. The Sherman girls got into foul trouble and were forced to frequently substitute their starters out of the game.

In the second quarter, the Cards seemed to lose a little bit

of hustle and let the Huskies slip back within biting range. At the half, the score was 32-27, in favor of lone, but the crowd was beginning to think this was going to be even closer when they came out of the locker room.

In the third and fourth quarters, lone out-rebounded and outscored their opponents, ending with the victory.

Dawn Boor led lone with 12 points. Brenda Burrigh followed closely with 11, and added six steals for lone. Suzy Heideman led the boards with 11, as the Lady Cards hustled for the win over Sherman to place themselves in contention for first place of the tournament.

Burrigh led the red and white with 13 points and Suzy Heideman added 12. Heideman added 14 rebounds and Burrigh also had seven steals to lead the team to the win. A highlight of the evening was Sybil Krebs, a freshman floater, who made her first two varsity points.

Maurice Jayne Elder

Maurice Jayne Elder, 87, of Heppner, died Friday, December 20, 1996, at Amber Valley Care Center in Pendleton.

A family memorial service will be held.

Mr. Elder was born September 12, 1909, at Heppner, to Frank and Jennie Jayne Elder. He attended school at Ritter.

During World War II, he was stationed in the South Pacific for four years. He was in a tank destroyer battalion and a recipient of the Purple Heart.

On July 2, 1951, he married Vivian Cason Prock at Pendleton. She died in January 1995.

Mr. Elder enjoyed the outdoors and spent many years employed as a ranch/farm hand and a cowboy riding the mountain ranges. In the 1970s, he owned and locally operated Agri-Chem Fertilizer in Morrow County.

Survivors include his sister, Mayree Elder of Bremerton, Washington; stepchildren, Colleen Ployhar of Heppner, Jimmy Prock of Heppner and Barbara Hale of Pendleton; 13 grandchildren and 16 great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, his wife, Vivian, brothers, John, George and Shirley, and sisters, Lucille Wilson and Elizabeth Ward; also two stepchildren, Wayne E. Prock and Janice Cutsforth.

PUBLIC NOTICE MORROW COUNTY LAND USE HEARING THE MORROW COUNTY

PLANNING COMMISSION will hold the following hearings of public interest on Monday, January 6, 1997, at 7:30 p.m. at the Public Works Building on State Highway 74 in Lexington:

Application for a Hardship Variance by Wayne and Lori Seitz to allow the siting of a second manufactured home on Tax Lot 4503 in Township 1 North, Range 26 (10.56 acres) in an Exclusive Farm Use (EFU) Zone. This parcel is located approximately seven miles northeast of Lexington. Access to the property is via State Highway No. 207 to Myers Road and then east on Myers 1.3 miles to a private gravel road. Criteria for approval includes Zoning Ordinance ARTICLE 7, Section 7.020 (B) (1) (2).

Conditional Use Permit Application No. N-97: Morrow County, Guy VanArsdale, applicant; Gene and Tom Doherty, owners. Property is described as tax lot 700 of Assessor's Map 1N 25 03, located on the north side of Juniper Road (County Road No. 630), at the intersection of Juniper Canyon Road (County Road No. 923), approximately three miles west of Bombing Range Road. Application is to allow the operation of a rock crusher and stockpiling of crushed rock for the County Public Works Department. Request is also to add the site to the Goal 5 aggregate inventory in the Comprehensive Plan. Criteria for approval include Zoning Ordinance Section 6.050 (9), and ARTICLE 8 and 215.298 (2).

The first of three public hearings to consider a zone designation of Farm Residential Two Acres (FR-2) for an unzoned area west of Paul Smith Road and Skoubo Lane between Kunze and West Extension Irrigation Canal. The area is located approximately one-half mile southwest of the City of Boardman. Criteria for approval include Zoning Ordinance Section 3.041 and ARTICLE 8.

Conditional Use Permit Application No. N-98: Donald E. Jorgensen, applicant and owner. Property is described as tax lot 2500 of Assessor's Map 5N 26 23D, located on the northwest corner of Old Highway 730 and Fourth Street West, approximately one-quarter mile west of the City of Irrigon. The proposal is to allow for a Home Occupation to park equipment at his home. Criteria for approval include Zoning Ordinance Section 3.040 (2) (H) and ARTICLE 6.

Conditional Use Permit Application No. N-99: Rod and Cindy Harley, applicants and owners. Property is described as tax lot 408 of Assessor's Map 5N 26 22, located west of Eighth Street West on the south side of Froberg Lane, a private road, approximately three miles west of the City of Irrigon. The proposal is to allow a mobile welding business and office at the home. Criteria for approval include Zoning Ordinance Section 3.040 (2) (H) and ARTICLE 6.

Conditional Use Permit Application No. N-100: Everett Shasteen, applicant; Mary Lynn Hurd owner. Property is described as tax lot 100 and 101 of Assessor's Map 4N 25 20A, located on the south side of Kunze road, approximately one mile southwest of the City of Boardman. The proposal is to operate an automobile repair business as a home occupation. Criteria for approval include Zoning Ordinance Section 3.050 (2) (H) and ARTICLE 6.

Opportunity to voice support or opposition to the above proposals or to ask questions will be provided. Failure to raise specific issues at this hearing precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals based on those issues.
