Weed tool available

The Morrow County small woodlands association has purchased a "weed-a-metre" granule applicator. This device can be used to spread pronone which is a dry granular formulation of Velpar, a grass killing herbicide.

This device will apply a measured dose of herbicide in a four-foot circle around a tree seedling when grass/moisture control is necessary for a new tree seedling survival and growth.

This device is available for loan to non-industrial small woodland owners for use in establishing new tree plantings.
