

Coach LaRue and IHS track team on the road again

The lone boys' and girls' track teams have been busy since the week before spring break. They have competed in two important weekend invitational meets this month, in addition to several Tuesday meets.

April 4, both teams competed against 20 other Oregon and Washington high schools in the Cherry Festival Twilight Meet at Wahtonka High School in The Dalles, with the following results:

Girls: 4x100 relay-fourth place, time (t) of 55.61; long jump-Nikki McElligott, second, distance (d) of 13'; long jump-Camie Burright, first, d 15'9"; high jump-McElligott, sixth, height (h) of 4'4"; pole vault-LaRee Anderson, first, h 7'6"; 400m run-Brenda Holtz, sixth, t 70.8; triple jump-C.
