Hoisington.

Heppner never let the lead fall out of their hands. The Rockets made a strong run at the lead in the sixth and seventh innings, but strong defensive play by Jeff Waterland, Shane Matheny and Josh Coiner held the one-run lead. The tie run was taken away by a foul ball. A ground out to the short stop ended the game in the Mustangs' favor.
