All open class sheep breeds will be on display August 21 through August 26. All open class dairy goat breeds will be presenting from August 27 through September 1. Steer classic planned at OSF

Wilco Farm Stores presents the fifth annual Steer Classic at the 1997 Oregon State Fair which will be held August 21 - September 1.

The classic, a finished, non-terminal, market steer show, has been the most popular spectator show of the livestock department and the fair is anticipating another exciting contest this year, said a state fair news release.

Open to all breeds, the Steer Classic will be held on August 22 at 6 p.m. in the beef show ring. Entry fee is \$50 which is non-refundable. Weigh-in will start at 8 a.m. on the day of the show.

Six awards will be presented and the total guaranteed jackpot is \$2,500. The champion steer will receive \$1,000; reserve champion, \$600; third place, \$360; fourth place, \$270; fifth place, \$180; and sixth place, \$90. The jackpot may increase depending on the number of entries received.

The winning steers will be selected based upon the animal's ability to meet today's consumer standards. These standards include general appearance, lean-to-fat ratio, muscle distribution, overall composition, structural soundness and size.
