Speaker of the House visits Heppner

Oregon Speaker of the House Lynn Lundquist was in Heppner last week where he addressed the Chamber of Commerce about the recently concluded legislature.

Lundquist said that despite what people may have heard in the press, the Oregon Legislature had a good productive session, and he cited the rewrite and passage of the property tax limitation measure 47, and the increased education funding as two good examples.

Lundquist pointed out that K-12 education in Oregon was funded with \$4.2 billion during the session, and that more money was placed in higher education allowing the freezing of college tuition.

Lundquist also said that the state budget was balanced without keeping the \$450 to \$500 million in refunds Oregon taxpayers are scheduled to receive under the state's "surplus kicker" law.

Lundquist did say that with the recent reduction in property taxes around the state, Oregonians now

he would run for the speakership again if possible. "Being speaker is very sobering," he said.

need "a third type of tax".

Admitting that proposing new taxes in Oregon "is political suicide" Lundquist said his approach is not to look for more taxes, but just the redistribution of how they are collected. "We don't just look for more total taxes. We need to look at the distribution of how we collect are taxes. We don't just need a new tax," he emphasized.

On the agricultural front Lundquist said there were no laws passed in the session that were "devastating" to agriculture, and that ag "came out pretty good".

Lundquist said he was disappointed that the transportation budget, including increased gas taxes, was not passed, and that the state needed the increased revenue to maintain its roads and highway system.

On his political plans, Lundquist said he was going to run for the legislature again, and that

Gunderson to play in Shrine game

After that the teams will be treated to a welcoming dinner at the college, sponsored by the LaGrande Chamber of Commerce. A seven-day

practice camp will start on Saturday morning and on the following Friday a parent-player picnic will be sponsored by the LaGrande Restaurant Association.

Pre-game pageantry will begin at 6 p.m. at Baker City High School's Bulldog Stadium on August 9. Kick-off will be at 7 p.m. Halftime activities will include the steer auction and footballs autographed by John Elway of the Denver Broncos and Jerry Rice and Steve Young of the San Francisco 49ers.
