Make BMCC appointments

Students returning to BMCC are reminded to call the Admissions and Advising Office at (541)278-5930 to make a registration appointment if they have not already done so. Students new to BMCC who plan to take nine credit hours or more must take a placement test before they can make a registration appointment. This includes students transferring from other colleges who have not had college level writing or math.

The ASSET placement test is given to help counselors and advisors assess student ability in reading, writing and math, ensuring that students take the appropriate classes for their skill level. Regular testings times are Monday and Thursday, beginning at 11 a.m. Appointments are not necessary. Immediately following the test, results will be assessed by a counselor and registration appointments for fall term will be made.
