The office has a message recorder so people can call any time day or night and leave a message and their call will be returned as soon as possible, said Michael.

A building open house will be held as soon as the streets and sidewalks are finished, she said. "Until then it may be a little inconvenient," Michael added. "But please remember the Extension office is here to serve you. So, call or stop by with any questions."
