Scott Groshens, who is attending school in La Grande, was a Lexington caller on Sunday.

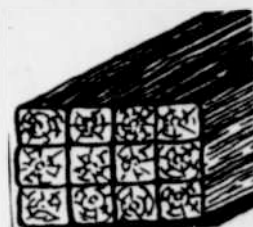
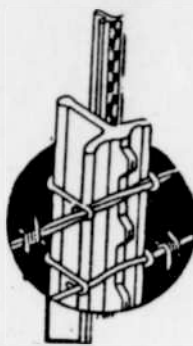
