

Mustangs JVs lose first game to Pirates

After opening the season with two wins, the Heppner Mustangs boys JV team lost Friday, Dec. 12, to the Riverside Pirates, 48-37.

The Mustangs took a 23-17 lead at halftime, but were outscored 31-14 in the second half, including 17-8 in the fourth quarter.

Ryan Matteson led the Mustangs with 15 points, including three three-pointers. Craig Scott had six points and Michael Schonbachler had five.

The Mustangs opened the year with a 37-32 win over the Condon Blue Devils on Tuesday, Dec. 2. They fell behind 15-7 after the first quarter, but battled back, outscoring the Blue Devils 16-9 in the fourth quarter to take the win.

Blake Knowles led the scoring with 12 points. Clint Bellamy had six points; Ryan Matteson had five and Brian Knowles had a three-point field goal.

On Thursday, Dec. 11, the JVs traveled to Ione and dominated the Cardinals, 50-24. The Mustangs jumped out to a 20-8 lead and cruised from there.

Clint Bellamy led the Mustangs with 12 points including 8-11 from the free throw line. Ryan Matteson had nine points includ-

ing a three-pointer and Michael Schonbachler scored six points. Corey Morgan led Ione with eight points.
