

Movie to be presented Sunday

"The Ride", a new dramatic film from World Wide Pictures, the motion picture ministry of the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association, will be shown on Sunday, January 18, beginning at 6 p.m. at the Christian Life Center, 535 W. Morgan Street, Heppner.

In the movie, Smokey Banks (Michael Biehn) has just been sentenced to community service and released into the custody of Mike Stillwell (Clarence Felder) and his wife, Ellen (Jennifer O'Neill), at the Saguaro Boys' Ranch. The former world champion bull rider has reached bottom, and now his only task is to teach 14-year-old Danny O'Neil (Brock Pierce) how to ride a bull.

Smokey agrees to the conditions only because he doesn't want to stay in jail and face a long line of others waiting to get their hands on him. He doesn't anticipate being so affected by young Danny's courage and

determination to ride. Neither does he anticipate Linnette (Jennifer Blanc), Mike's attractive and spirited niece.

When Smokey learns that Danny is dying of cancer, he doesn't want to stick around to see it. He's become unexpectedly attached to his little sidekick and doesn't think he can face the reality of the boy's illness. He also doesn't think he can accept the God the Stillwells have shared with him ... a God who would allow something like this to happen to an innocent child like Danny.

But, according to the movie news release, Smokey still has some things to learn about life--when to hold on and push through, when to let go and trust, and most of all, that God is someone who really can be trusted, despite how things appear on the surface.

Grand reopening set at waterpark

The Willow Creek Waterpark in Heppner will celebrate its "grand reopening" on Saturday, Jan. 24, from 1-4 p.m. at the pool.

Those attending may tour the facility, watch swimming and exercise demonstrations, see the personalized bricks which have been installed, sign up for classes, purchase season passes or spa punch cards and pick up a 1998 waterpark schedule.

The outdoor pool will be open from June 13 to August 23 this year. Swimming lessons will be offered weekdays from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 4-7 p.m. Open swim will be from 1-3:30 p.m. and from 7-9 p.m. Family swim will be from 5-8 p.m. weekends.

Outdoor pool fees for a single session will be \$1.50 for those five and under; \$2 for students under 18; \$2.50 for adults; and \$6 for a family swim. Season passes purchased before March 1

will be \$150 for a family and \$60 for an individual. Season passes purchased after March 1 will be \$160 for a family and \$75 for an individual. Swim lessons will be \$20 for pass holders and \$30 for those without passes.

The multi-use spa will be open from Saturday, Jan. 24-Dec. 1. Exercise classes will be held on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays for 12 weeks as follows: session 1-Jan. 26-Feb. 20; session 2-Feb. 23-March 20; and session 3-April 6-May 1. Advanced registration will be required. Hours will be from 8-8:30 a.m., 12:15-12:45 p.m., 1:30-2 p.m. and 6-6:30 p.m.

Thirty-minute spa appointments may be scheduled on Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays from 9 a.m.-9 p.m. by leaving a message on the waterpark's answering machine, 676-5752, at least 24 hours in advance. Those making appointments should leave their names, date, preferred time of appointment and a phone number for confirmation.

Cost for the exercise classes will be \$35 a session. Single admission will be \$2.50. Spa punch cards will be \$25 for 10 visits.
