

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office in Heppner reports handling or dispatching the following business over the past several weeks:

Jan. 19: Boardman Police Dept. received a request for an officer to contact him regarding a tenant that was having some property repossessed;

MCSO received a report of a swerving driver in a white Ford pickup;

MCSO received a report from Good Shepherd Community Hospital of possible child abuse;

Boardman Fire Dept. and ambulance, Hermiston ambulance and Oregon State Police received a report of a motor vehicle accident on I-84 westbound, milepost 174 near the median. It was unknown if injuries occurred;
