

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office in Heppner reports handling or dispatching the following business over the past several weeks:

Feb. 2: MCSO dispatched to the Boardman Police Dept. a report of three shots fired in an area west of 4th and Old Highway 30 in Irrigon.
