#### Lexington Baptist

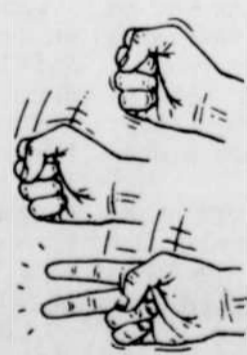

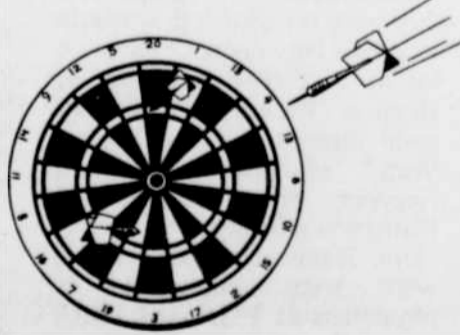
