Kenneth Alyn DuVall, 67, of Sun City, Arizona, a retired architect, died April 12, 1998, in Phoenix.

Graveside services will be held in the Lexington Cemetery on June 6, 1998, at 2 p.m.

Mr. DuVall served in the U.S. Coast Guard for four years. He and his wife, June VanWinkle, met in Portland and were married at St. Patrick's Parish on September 9, 1951. The DuValls retired in 1994 and moved to Arizona from Bellevue, Washington.

DA's Report

The Morrow County District Attorney's office in Heppner reports handling the following business:

William D. Wilson, 25, Boardman was convicted of Probation Revocation and sentenced to 30 days in jail with extended probation for one year.

Gary Newkirk, 28, Heppner, was convicted of Rape I, two counts of Attempted Rape in the First Degree and six counts of Sexual Abuse I. He was sentenced to 40 months in the Oregon State Penitentiary, one year in the county jail and three years post-prison supervision.

Lucy J. Francis, 25, Boardman, was convicted of Criminal Misdemeanor in the First Degree and sentenced to 30 days in the county jail with three years probation during which she is to be evaluated and undergo anger management, plus pay a fine of \$250 attorney fees and assessments.

Donna Jean Acock, 33, Boardman, was convicted of Delivery of a Controlled Substance and sentenced to three years probation, a fine of \$350, undergo evaluation and treatment for substance abuse, 80 hours of community service and pay attorney fees and assessments.

Regino Landros Navarro, 35, Boardman, was convicted of Driving while License Suspended and sentenced to six months in county jail, suspended on the condition he pay a fine of \$500, attorney fees and assessments.
