A new office has been completed at the rodeo grounds in Heppner. Sue Gibbs of the Oregon Trail Pro Rodeo Committee says that the office will provide shade and a rest area for rodeo contestants, a meeting place and storage.

Eckman Construction completed the office renovation. Kinzua Resources donated \$700 in materials and Blue Mountain Lumber Products, \$1,400, for construction.

Gibbs says that the new crowd's nest at the rodeo grounds has also been completed, as has handicap access. She says that the new handicap facilities will allow a person to drive up, unload a wheelchair onto a cement slab and then proceed up the ramp to the rodeo stands.

She said that a slab has been poured for handicap restrooms, but more funding will be required for construction of the actual facilities.
