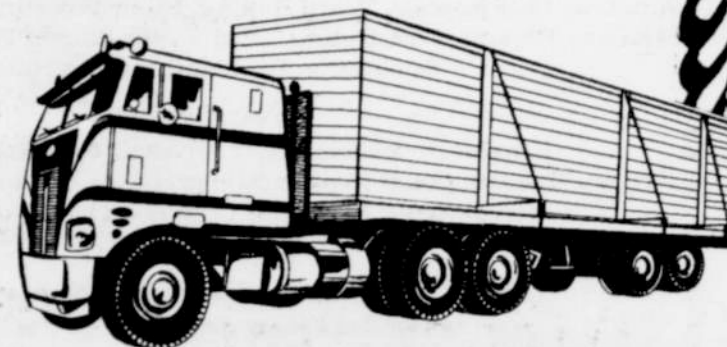

Everyone is invited to attend the 1998 Morrow County Fair Wednesday, August 19, through

Sunday, August 23.

The theme for this year's fair is "One County, All Communities Working Hand in Hand".

The fair opens for public viewing at 9 a.m. on Wednesday and winds down Sunday when 4-H exhibits are released from 9 a.m. to noon. Commercial entries and booths will be released Sunday at 12:30 p.m.

The fair will feature food, entertainment, booths, displays, contests, live music, a street dance and market sales.

Admission to the fair is \$2 daily for adults; \$1 daily for children six-12 years; and children under six will be admitted free with an adult. Season passes are \$6 at the fair office or main gate.

Fair admission does not admit one to the rodeo.
