


# VOTING INSTRUCTIONS

At the General Election of 1998 the voters of Morrow County will cast their votes on the ballot illustrated below.

## WHEN VOTING YOUR BALLOT AT THE POLLING PLACE:

1. USE ONLY THE PENCIL PROVIDED.
2. TO VOTE YOU MUST BLACKEN THE OVAL (●) COMPLETELY!

**EXAMPLE**  
PRESIDENT (VOTE FOR ONE)

3. TO WRITE-IN A NAME — YOU MUST BLACKEN THE OVAL (●) AND WRITE-IN THE NAME ON THE DOTTED LINE, WHERE APPLICABLE.
4. DO NOT CROSS OUT — IF YOU CHANGE YOUR MIND, EXCHANGE YOUR BALLOT FOR A NEW ONE.
5. AFTER VOTING — INSERT BALLOT IN THE BALLOT BOX. DO NOT FOLD THE BALLOT.
