Eldon R. Gilbert, 79, of Heppner, died Sunday, November 8, 1998, at Pioneer Memorial Hospital.

Former Heppner area resident, John William Wood, 86, of Eugene, died Wednesday, November 11, 1998, in Eugene.

John William Wood was born September 8, 1912, at Ellington, Missouri, to Walter Nathaniel and Laura George Wood.

He served with the Army Air Force in England during World War II and also served during the Korean Conflict. After World War II, he owned a hardware store at Enterprise. He enjoyed outdoor work more than storekeeping and spent the next 30 years working as a carpenter and building contractor.

In 1965, he and his wife moved back to her family home on Willow Creek near Heppner. While this was to be the beginning of retirement, Mr. Wood continued working at his carpentry trade. He was unable to turn down people wanting him to do "just one more little project."

Mr. Wood was active in the Masonic Lodge for many years and was honored as a 33 degree Mason. He was also active in the Shrine and American Legion.

In Heppner, he was an active volunteer at the Heppner Senior Center and the United Methodist Church.

Mr. Wood was the last of his three brothers and three sisters still living.

Survivors include his wife of 55 years, Louise; son, Walt Wood of Eugene; and grandchildren, Elisabeth, John and Timothy.
