

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

New program to aid developmentally disabled

The Family Support Program of Morrow/Wheeler counties is centered on providing unconventional assistance to children and adults with developmental disabilities.

The Family Support Program will provide a broad spectrum of services to families who have remarkable care-giving needs associated with having a member with developmental disabilities living at home, according to a news release.

Some examples of assistance that the Family Support Program can provide include the preparation of a support plan for services; assistance to access already established groups and agencies in order to develop, improve and increase access to specialized resources; development and coordination of support; financial assistance directly to or on behalf of families and individuals to offset part or all of the costs of services noted in a family support plan.

Some of the services which can be paid by the Family Support

Program include architectural modifications, adaptive equipment, and specialized clothing, medical, dental and therapy services, transportation, respite, information/education for families and other expenses related to the effects of the person's disability on the family.

One hundred percent of individuals served by this program must be eligible for developmental disabilities case management services. Those who are interested in admission to this program must contact Patti Pappas, developmental disabilities case manager at Morrow County Behavioral Health, 676-9161.

The Family Support steering committee is also seeking participants who are interested in being a part of the planning process. These members can be developmentally disabled individuals, family members, neighbors or any one else in the community who would like to participate and invest their time into this project.
