SCERT applications called for

Morrow County is encouraging communities, special districts and non-profit organizations to submit applications for funds through the SCERT process. Information and applications can be obtained by contacting Dan Brosnan, Morrow County Commissioner-elect, at (541) 676-5623, P.O. Box 788 Heppner, OR 97836.

The SCERT process has two categories: "Community/Infrastructure" and "Other."

Projects will be evaluated and prioritized by the county court, in cooperation with the Economic Development Committee that consists of representatives from each community in Morrow County.

Projects within the Community and Infrastructure category must be "ready to proceed", with all engineering and feasibility studies done. The Other category will enable communities to apply for funds

for marketing feasibility studies, curriculum development proposals, preliminary planning or engineering elements for projects that are not "ready to proceed."

All applications must be submitted to the office of the Morrow County Court no later than January 8.
