She lived on the plains of Kansas until about eight years of age and had vivid memories of living in a sod house at one time. In the summer she and her two sisters would gather buffalo chips to use as fuel in the cookstove and they played in the buffalo wallows.

From Kansas the family moved to Sibert, Colorado, by wagon train. When she was around the age of 10, the family made a move to Gresham by train. When the train stopped at Multnomah Falls, she was sure this must be the most beautiful sight in the world.

The family spent approximately five years in Gresham. The lush fruit of the valley was such a treat and her love of fruit continued in her senior years.

From Gresham the family moved to Ione, where she completed high school. In 1918, she married Kenneth Blake and they had three children.

Mrs. Blake loved cooking and baking and was noted for her cooking-especially breads and cakes.

Survivors include her daughter, Bethal Heinrichs, Heppner; eight grandchildren, 11 great-grandchildren and two great, great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by two sons, Darrel Blake and Bill Blake.

During the eight week program, MacDonald completed a variety of training which included classroom study and practical instruction on naval customs, first aid, firefighting, water safety and survival, and shipboard and aircraft safety. An emphasis was also placed on physical fitness.

MacDonald is a 1997 graduate of North Eugene High School, Eugene.

Army National Guard Pfc. Christopher L. Gibson has graduated from One Station Unit Training (OSUT) at Fort Knox, Ky. The training included basic military training and advanced individual training.

The first eight weeks of initial entry training included basic combat training, drill and ceremonies, weapons, map reading, tactics, military courtesy, military justice, physical fitness, first aid and Army history and traditions.

During advanced individual training, the soldier was trained as an armor crewman to serve in tank units and conduct defensive and offensive combat operations. The trainee was instructed to operate, service and maintain armor tracked and wheeled vehicles, load and fire tank weapon systems, perform ammunition handling and supply duties and assist in target detection and identification.

Gibson is the son of Richard and Elizabeth Gibson of Irrigon. He is a 1998 graduate of Riverside High School, Boardman.

Army National Guard Pvt. Francis D. Elliott has graduated from One Station Unit Training (OSUT) at Fort Knox, Ky. The training combines basic military training and advanced individual training.

The first eight weeks of initial entry training include drill and ceremonies, weapons, map reading, tactics, military courtesy, military justice, physical fitness, first aid and Army history and traditions.

During the final seven weeks, soldiers receive advanced individual training as cavalry scouts. The training includes subjects and instructions to operate, maintain and fire M2/M3 Bradley fighting vehicles, call and adjust fire on enemy targets, recognize friendly and threat vehicles, conduct reconnaissance and security missions, perform foot patrols, conduct land navigation, locate and neutralize mines and operate and maintain scout vehicles.
