Donald Lawrence Linnell, 75, Hermiston, died at his home on Friday, April 12.

Memorial services were Wednesday April 28, at Burns Mortuary Chapel in Hermiston. Private family burial of cremains will be in the Hermiston

Donald Linnell was born July 14, 1923, on a ranch in Mayville to Charles and Jessie Koch Linnell (Hartfield).

He attended schools in Mayville and graduated from Arlington High School. He enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Corps in December of 1941 serving in active duty in England with the 211th, AAF, BA, and was honorably discharged as a corporal in September, 1945. On June 4, 1947, he married Maxine Zastrow at a ceremony in The Dalles. After working for Caterpillar Tractor, they moved to a wheat and cattle ranch near Arlington, where they raised registered Angus and quarter horses. He was a charter member of the Condon BPOE, Gilliam County Fair Board, Gilliam County Lions Club, Arlington Saddle Club, Mid-Columbia Saddle Club, the Oregon Trail Snowmobile Club, Morrow County Board of Equalization, and the Oregon Angus Association. His other interests included hunting, fishing and traveling throughout the United States and the world.

He was preceded in death by

both his parents, his brother Charles, step-brothers Harold and Elwood Hartfield, and a step-sister Martha Anderson.
