## Museum to host treasures of Oregon exhibit

AT&T Treasures of Oregon, showcasing more than 150 artifacts of Oregon and Northwest history from the collections of the Oregon Historical Society, will be in Heppner on Sunday and Monday, May 16 and 17.

Literally a "traveling exhibit," the exhibit is on the road throughout Oregon in 1999 in a 48 foot truck and trailer which will be parked beside the Heppner City Park near the museum.

Featuring such artifacts as 10,000 year old sagebrush sandals, a sea chest belonging to Captain Robert Gray who first sailed into and named the

Columbia River and Jackson Sundown's 1916 trophy saddle from the Pendleton Roundup, the exhibit will be open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. both Sunday and Monday.

## St. Jude bike riders brave winds to raise funds

Sixty-four bike riders braved less than ideal conditions at the annual Ione Bike-a-thon on Sunday, April 25, said spokesperson Anne Morter. Funds raised from the event benefit St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis, TN.

Organizers consider the ride a success based on the amount of money raised and the level of enthusiasm displayed by the participants, said Morter. Counting both courses, approximately 1245 bike miles were logged in a 3 1/2 hour span.

Fifty riders in all age groups tackled the 22 mile Ruggs to Ione route. Tom McElligott and Gaylin Fickel, both of Heppner, were the first riders in, arriving in one hour, 37 minutes. The leaders were followed closely by Colin McElligott, Adam McCabe, Randi McElligott

and Jim McElligott. The youngest rider to complete the course was Taylor Parks, five, who navigated the route with training wheels.

Teonna Vandever led the in-town route group with 25 one-mile laps, followed by Kaylee Palmateer, Clayton Morter and William Wehri with 23 miles each.

A list of riders will soon be posted. Participants are asked to turn in pledges and donations by Monday, May 17 so that prizes may be ordered. Funds should be turned in with the pledge sheet in an envelope to be Bank of Eastern Oregon in Ione, Tom McElligott at Morrow County Abstract and Title in Heppner, or to Morter.

All funds raised from this event go directly to St. Jude Children's Hospital. All supplies for the local event were donated.
