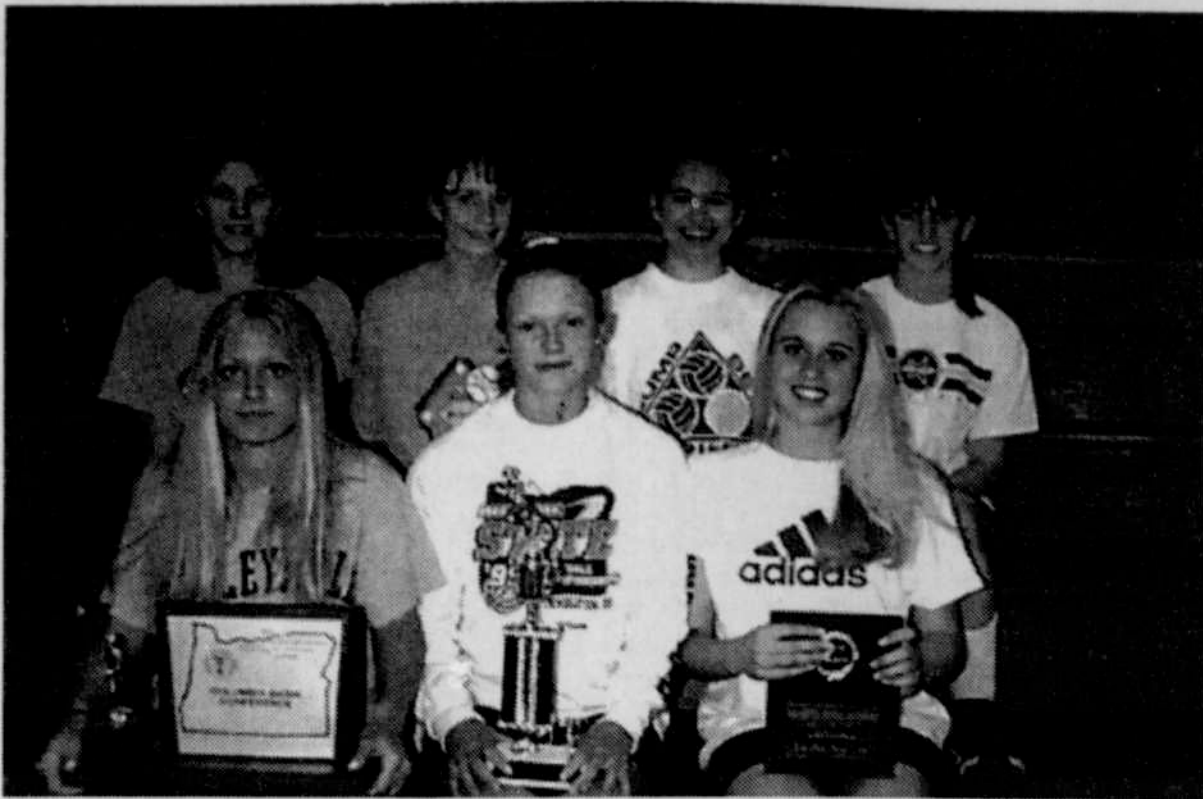


## HHS track team to send 14 to state

This year the HHS girls' team won trophies for second place for District 7-2A and first place in the CBC/Big Sky Invitational at Condon and tied for second place at the Goldendale Invitational.

The Heppner High School track team will send 14 athletes, seven girls and seven boys, to the 2A state track tournament this Friday and Saturday, May 21-22, at Monmouth.

The Heppner girls took second place at the district meet in Hermiston May 14 and 15 in Hermiston. They had 100 points to Pilot Rock's 117.

The Heppner boys were third at the district meet with 88 points, behind winner Stanfield with 147 points and runner up Wahtonka with 132.

Heppner girls qualifying for state with first or second-place finishes at district include Amber Peck, Brooke Boyer, Casey Ingraham, Abby Kahl, Paula Spicerkuhn and Trisha Adams. Amy Papineau will attend as an alternate.

Boys qualifying include Jared Eckman, Levi Geer, Casey Evans, Michael Schonbachler, David Piper, Ryan Matteson and Craig Scott.

Amber Peck, a senior this year, won the 100-meter dash with a time of 12.71 and took second in the 300-meter low hurdles with a time of 48.6. Peck was a part of the 1600-meter relay team, along with juniors Trisha Adams and Abby Kahl and senior Brooke Boyer, who took first at district with a time of 4:16.07. Peck was also a member of the 100-meter relay, with Adams, Boyer and junior Casey Ingraham, who finished second with a time of 52.54.

Ingraham also took two first place finishes, in the long jump at 16'1/4" and the triple jump at 34'4", and set a new school triple jump record.

Boyer was second in the 400 meter dash with a time of 1:03.3; Kahl was second in the 800 meter dash with 2:29.26; and Spicerkuhn was second in the 3,000 meter run at 13:12.

Senior Jared Eckman was first

in the high jump with a jump of 6'2". Eckman also finished fourth in the 100m with a time of 11.9 and fourth in the triple jump with a 39'9" jump. He, along with juniors Michael Schonbachler and Levi Geer and senior Casey Evans, ended first in the 100 meter relay, with a time of 45.6. Sophomore Craig Scott will run in the 100m relay at state in place of Eckman who will be competing in the high jump.

Evans also won the 400 meter with a time of 52.14 and first in the 1600 meter relay along with sophomore Ryan Matteson, Schonbachler and Geer, with a time of 3:38.2. He took third in the high jump with a 5'10" jump.

Schonbachler will also go to state in the discus, finishing second at district with a throw of 124'9". He was sixth at district in the 200 meter dash with a time of 2.43.

Geer was also first in the 800 meters with a time of 2:07.90.

David Piper was second at district in the high jump (statistics unavailable) and seventh in the long jump with a jump of 17'4-1/4" and seventh in the triple jump with a jump of 36'10".

Scott was fourth in the 300 meter hurdles with a 43.4 and fifth in the 110 meter hurdles with a 17.0.

Matteson was sixth in the 400 meters with a 55.9.

## Mustangs to face Bulldogs at district

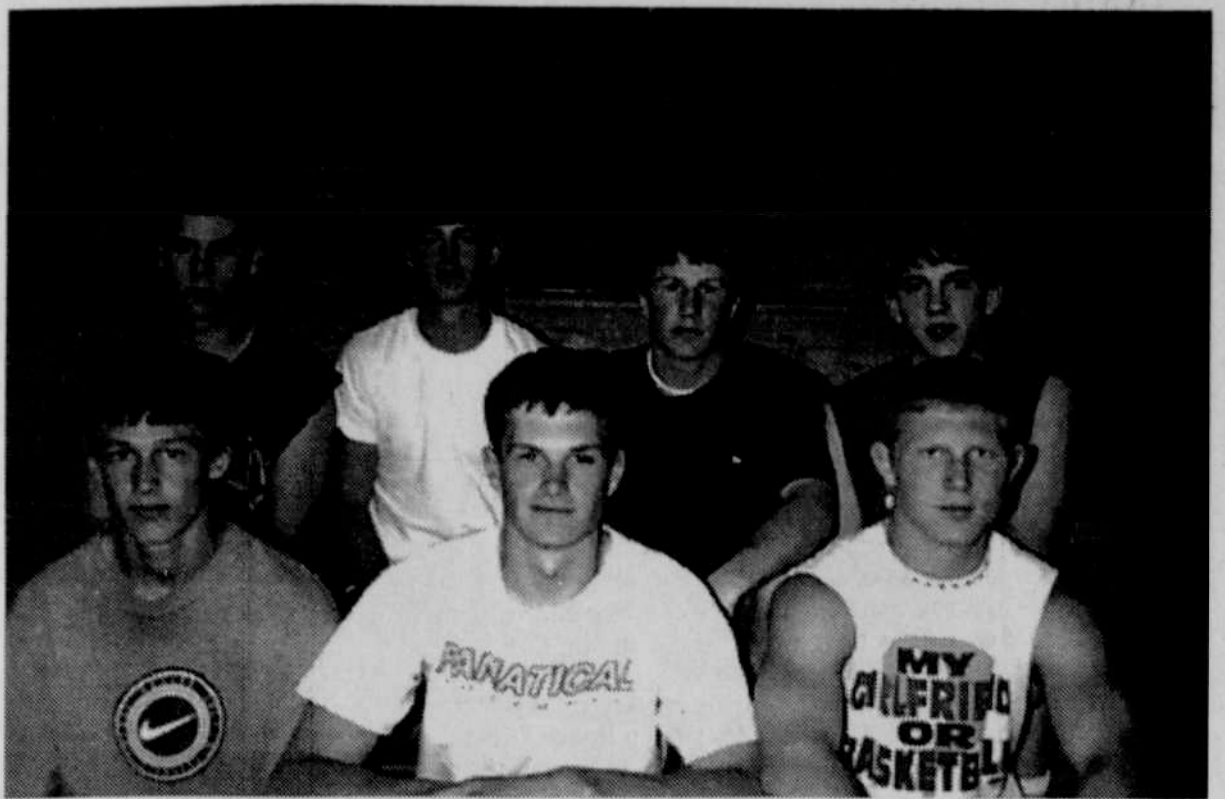

Sherman County and Pilot

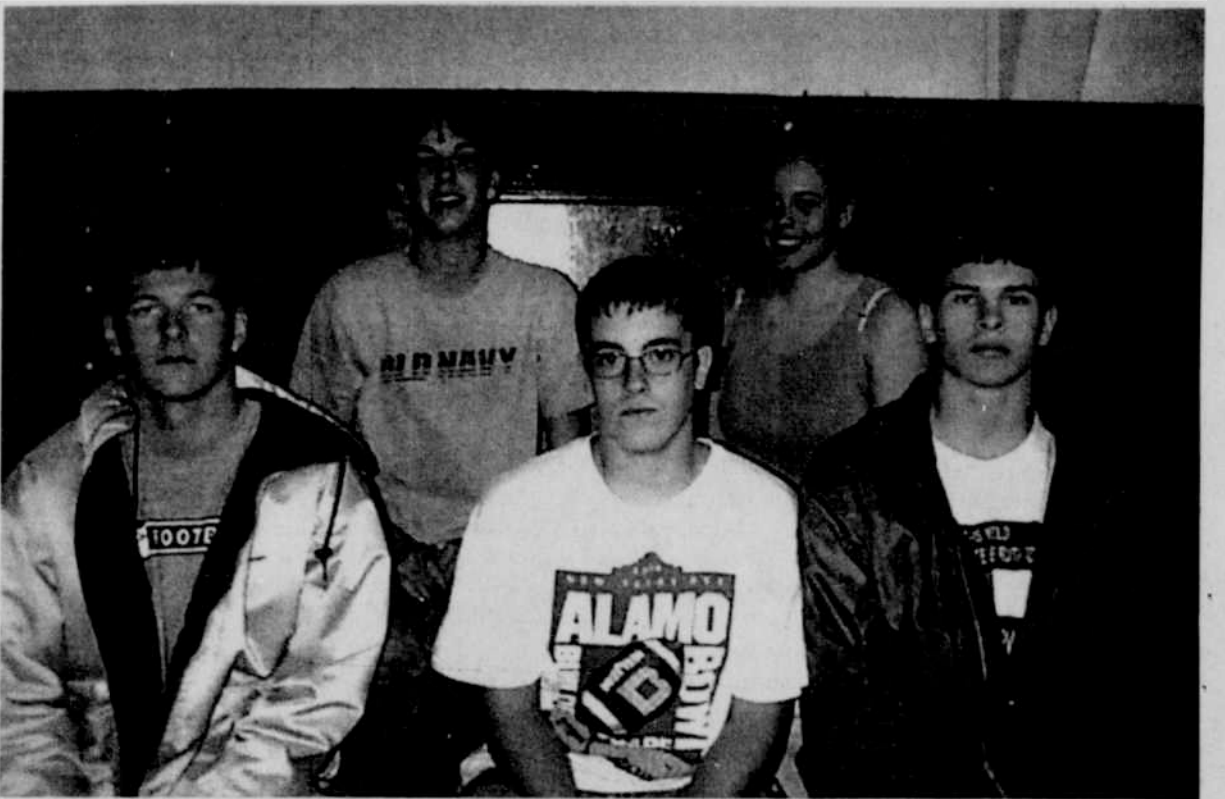

## Ione track team heads to state

The Ione Cardinal track team will send five to the state championship meet in Monmouth this weekend, May 21-22.

The Cardinal girls' team, lead by junior Nikki McElligott with four wins, ended up in fourth place at district this past weekend, May 14-15, with 64 points. The Dufur girls' team was first with 100 points followed by Condon, 95, and South Wasco County.

The Ione boys were third at the district meet with 105 points. First place was South Wasco, 137, and second was Helix, 106.

McElligott took first in the triple jump with a 36'3" jump; first in the high jump with a 5' jump; first in the 300-meter hurdles with a time of 45.3; and first in the 100 meter hurdles with a time of 15.6.

McElligott's 300 meter hurdle

time broke her own meet record of 48.5, the school record of 46.5, and the all-time 1A record of 45.7.

Freshman Brad Burrigh won the triple jump with a jump of 43'3", besting the 1A freshman record of 40'2-1/2" and his personal record by more than three feet; won the 110 hurdles with a time of 15.55; took second in the high jump with 5'8"; and second in the 300 hurdles with a 42.7, another personal record.

Junior Dan Scott took first place in the pole vault a 10' jump and three second place finishes in the 100 meters with a time of 11.71, the 200 meters with 23.96 and the 400 meters with 53.6.

Freshman Cindy Heagy was first in the pole vault with a 6' vault, second in the 800 meter run with 2:47 and third in the 400 meters with 67.06.

Senior Ryan Bennetto won the javelin with a throw of 164'8"

## Disaster series offered through BMCC, ARC

Blue Mountain Community College and the American Red Cross have teamed up to bring a three-part disaster series to Heppner on May 25, 26 and 27. The classes are free to interested participants, but pre-registration is required. Classes must be taken in order.

Introduction to Disasters will be offered on Tuesday, May 25, from 6-9 p.m. at Heppner High School.

The class is designed to help community volunteers respond to their neighbor's needs in the event of a disaster. The class covers basic information about disaster and its effects and outlines the roles of agencies (both government and non-government) in disaster relief. Participants are introduced to American Red Cross Disaster Services and are alerted to procedures for general disaster preparedness.

Mass Care is scheduled for Wednesday, May 26, from 6-9 p.m., also at Heppner High School. The prerequisite for this class is Intro to Disasters. The class provides basic information about the activities for mass care in disaster relief which impact a large number of people and introduces the participants to American Red Cross Disaster Services.

Shelter Operations is the final class in the series, scheduled for Thursday, May 27, from 6-9 p.m. Prerequisites are Intro to Disasters and Mass Care. This class provides basic information on the operation of a shelter in the event of a disaster.
