

Former Heppner man earns degree

The Monterey Institute of International Studies awarded a Master of Arts in Translation and Interpretation to Ken Curtis, formerly of Heppner, at spring commencement ceremonies on May 16, in Monterey, CA. Curtis completed his bachelor's degree in anthropology at Oregon State University. He also completed a master of arts degree in East Asian studies from Stanford University. While at the Institute, he completed a thesis project translating excerpts from the book Nihon no Zais (The Japanese Tax System). While at the institute, Curtis was a linguistic intern at Omega International, a translation and localization firm. He hopes to work as an editor and translator for a research institution in East Asia. Curtis is the son of Rick and Liz Curtis, formerly of Heppner. The Monterey Institute of International Studies, established in 1955, is "at the forefront of international education, preparing students for successful

careers in the private, public, nonprofit and educational sectors. Students and faculty share a common interest in the languages, and the economics, business and political systems of the world. The Institute's 750 students come from over 40 countries, and more than 90 percent of them have lived, worked, or studied outside their native countries," said a news release.
