## Corps cuts off water flow

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers warned irrigators that water flowing into Willow Creek was to be cut off for about four hours between noon and 4 p.m. on June 9.

The Corps needed about that much time to inspect a water quality structure on the dam to assess needed repairs. During this time, the current flow of about 11 cubic feet per second (cfs) of water was to be reduced to 3 cfs, said Corps hydrologist Russ Davidson.

In about two weeks the flows will need to be decreased again so repairs can be made. The exact date and times will be

announced prior to that closure. The water quality structure allows the Corps to release clean surface water into the creek, rather than drawing and releasing the sulfur-smelling water from near the bottom of the lake.

"We want to inspect and repair the structure now while the weather is fairly mild so our disruption to the irrigators is minimized," Davidson said. In addition, the sooner the structure is working, the better the creek will smell."

Once the structure is in place, the flows in the creek will return to about 11 cfs.

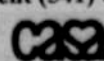
