## Flagger killed by semi-truck

A Pendleton woman, Debra Ann Cousins, 44, was killed by a semi truck on Highway 730 between Boardman and Irrigon around 12:30 p.m. Monday, June 28.

Morrow County District Attorney David C. Allen said the semi was driven by Julian Garcia Lopez, 35. According to Allen, the semi is believed to have just exited the freeway and was headed east bound when it hit Cousins, who was a flagger

ushering vehicles onto one-way traffic to accommodate construction. The impact threw her into another vehicle.

The accident occurred near a bridge where guardrail was being installed around milepost 169.

Cousins, who was employed with Sam's Flagging company out of Hermiston, was transported by the Boardman ambulance to Good Shepherd Hospital in Hermiston where she was pronounced dead.

Lopez was driving a 1985 Freightliner with a 40-foot trailer. The semi driven by Lopez is owned by Strebin Farms.

The accident is under investigation, says Allen.

Violators found guilty of starting a forest fire may be assessed fire suppression costs or be subject to a fine.
