Richard Lundell, 88, of Pendleton, died Sunday, June 27, 1999, at St. Anthony Hospital in Pendleton.

Recitation of the Rosary was at the chapel at Burns Mortuary of Pendleton on Wednesday, June 30, 1999. Funeral Mass was Thursday, July 1, 1999 at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Pendleton with burial at the Heppner Masonic Cemetery in Heppner.

Mr. Lundell was born August 26, 1910, at Gooseberry, to Ernest Richard and Lena Pearl Baker Lundell. He grew up at Ione and attended Ione schools, graduating from Ione High School in 1928.

DA's Report

On July 2, Marion Taylor, III was found guilty of Assault in the Fourth Degree after a trial to the court. Taylor was convicted for assaulting Chris Williams on May 16, 1999. Taylor struck Williams in the eye and nose with a 22-ounce beer bottle. Williams suffered a broken nose and received stitches over his eye as a result of the blow.

Taylor was charged and tried on the charge of Assault in the Second Degree, a Measure Eleven offense that would have carried a mandatory minimum sentence of 70 months in prison. On the lesser offense of Assault in the Fourth Degree, Taylor faces a maximum of one year in jail.

The offense for which Mr. Taylor was convicted occurred only two days after Taylor had appeared in court on an unrelated Assault in the Second Degree charge, where it is alleged he stabbed a man with a knife. Taylor had previously been released from jail on that charge pursuant to a conditional release granted by Judge Jeff Wallace over the state's objection, said the DA. Trial is set on that charge for August 13, at 9:30 a.m.

In support of his decision to convict on the lesser offense of Assault in the Fourth Degree, Judge Jeff Wallace found the glass beer bottle did not constitute a dangerous weapon in this case, said the DA. A dangerous weapon is defined as any instrument "which under the circumstances it is used is readily capable of causing death or serious physical injury."

Taylor will be sentenced on July 8.
