Blanche L. Ransom

Blanche L. Ransom, 94, of Ione, formerly of Milton-Freewater, died Saturday, July 17, 1999, at Ione.

Graveside service was held at the Milton-Freewater Cemetery on Wednesday, July 21, 1999.

She was born June 13, 1905, to George and Katie Akers Parman, on the family homestead in the Gooseberry area near Ione. In 1910, the family moved to Milton-Freewater where she attended Ferndale Grade School and graduated from McLoughlin Union High School. Mrs. Ransom attended Normal School at Cheney, Washington, then taught in the Dayton, Washington area.

On December 3, 1927, she married George H. Ransom at Walla Walla. They farmed fruit ranches in the Milton-Freewater area and also farmed her parents' homestead for 12 years. Mrs. Ransom returned to the Ione area after the death of her husband in 1986.

She enjoyed cooking, sewing, fishing and traveling.

Survivors include daughters, Shirley McNary of Ione and Carolyn Reynolds of Las Vegas, Nevada; five grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband, George, and her brother, Elton Parman.
