

County court meets

The Morrow County Court, at their August 18 meeting, approved a landowner's request for an approach on Patterson Ferry Road. Public Works Director Van Arsdale provided the court the daily traffic count results for Washington Street. The court asked him to contact School Superintendent Bruce Anderson about his request for gravel near Sam Boardman Elementary School.

The court reviewed the tippage fee distribution policy and discussed with Finance Director Kelli Currin the cash balance, anticipated revenues and commitments for tippage fees. They noted an update on the status of Lexington's B Street Bridge project. After reviewing the 1997-98 SCERT list and the projects on that list that were awarded tippage fees, the court examined the 1999 SCERT list and applications for tippage fee monies. As commissioner Brosnan was at a meeting in Portland, the court tentatively approved allocations, choosing to make final approval next week when the full court will be present.

The court approved resources for purchase of panels for the Fair and Rodeo.

The court and Sheriff Verlin Denton discussed his department's statistical report for the first half of the year. Denton pointed out areas of increase over the 1998 statistics for the same period and explained that some increase in arrests may be attributed to increased jail space. Denton also reported that the State Department of Corrections has approached him about possible use of the shooting range for training of their personnel. For the installation of the enhanced 911 system, the court approved a non-disclosure agreement with Sprint. Sheriff Denton also reported on the status of renovations at the Sheriff's Office.

County Counsel Bill Hanlon updated the court on the "Big Five" memorandum of understanding and answered some questions about the Community Solutions Team. He and the court discussed the Fair Board's purchase of panels, and, for the bond counsel, the court agreed to resolutions for financing of the Docken Building and the Wilkinson Arena. Hanlon reported that discussions with counsel for PGE, regarding the Ione-Boardman Road, have "stalled," and that Planning Director Tamra Mabbott has been in communication with Boeing about compliance with its zoning permit. Also with county counsel, the court reviewed the designations of authority, should an emergency arise when only one or none of the commissioners were available.

Judge Tallman reported that the city of Boardman has chosen not to adopt the county's weed control ordinance but to draft an intergovernmental agreement, instead. He reported having signed the State Incentive Cooperative Agreement to renew the \$50,000 grant for a prevention coordinator in the Behavioral Health Department. The court appointed Dean Large to the Solid Waste Advisory Committee.
