Colts rip Les Schwab team 26-0

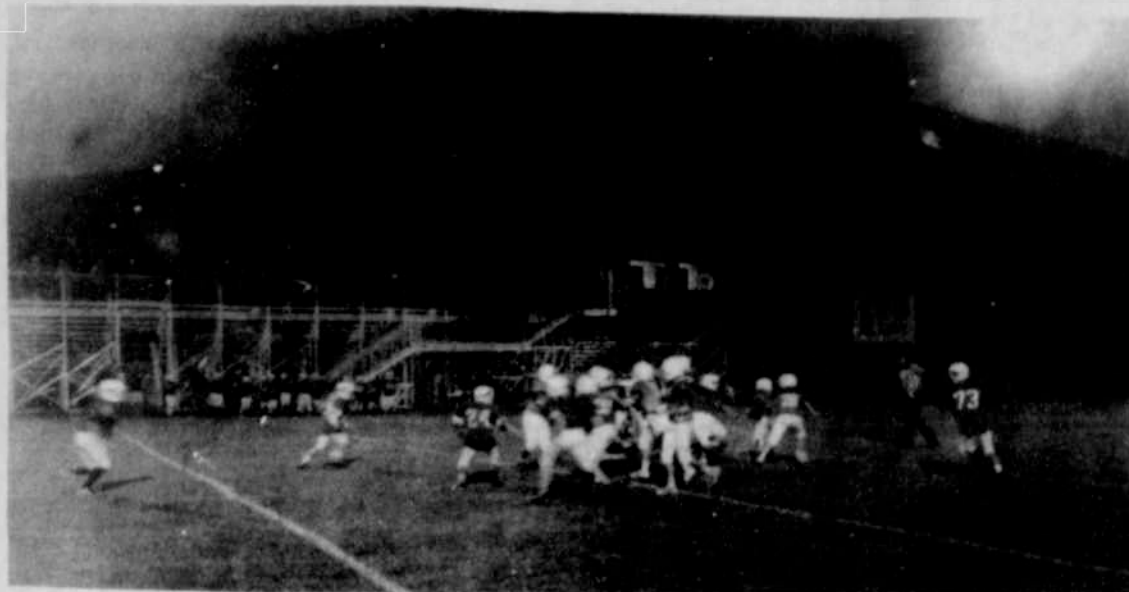

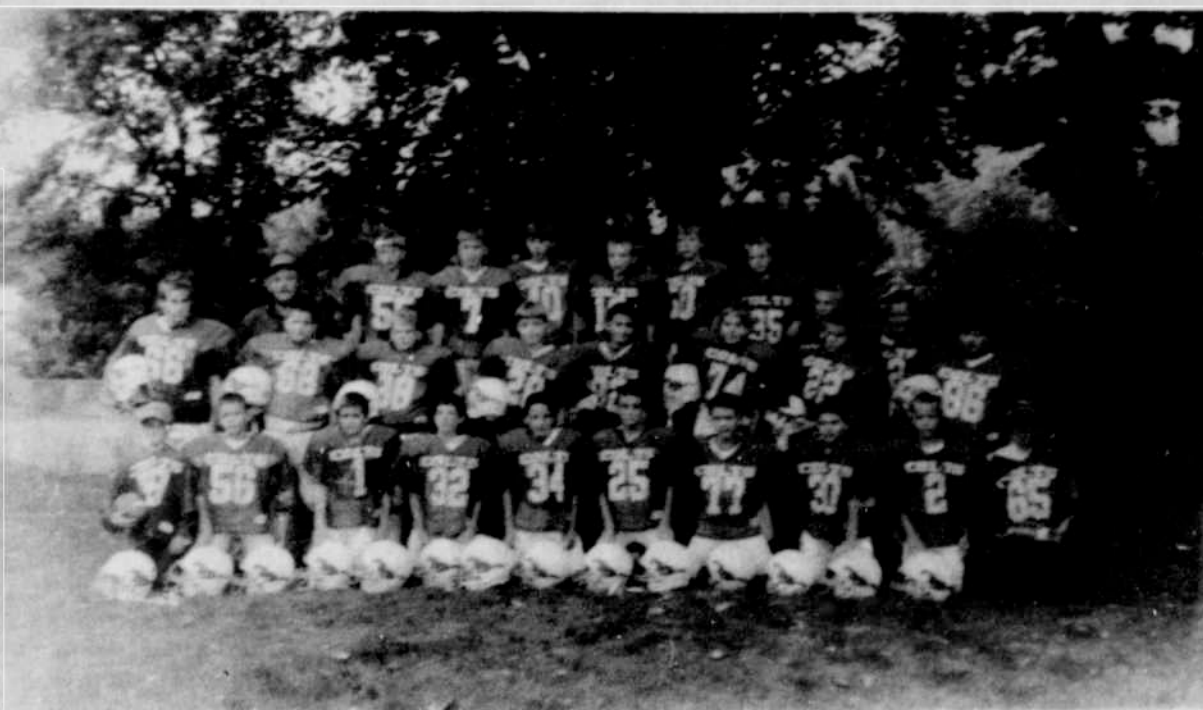

The Heppner Colts moved to 2-0 on the season by defeating the visiting Les Schwab team from Hermiston, 26-0, during a welcome rainstorm.

The Colts' suffocating defense got four turnovers and didn't allow the Les Schwab team to get inside their 30 yard line all game.

The Colts got the ball on a fumble recovery by Gordon Wedgesworth at midfield to set up their first touchdown. Connor Kilkenny and Matt Kenny picked up good yardage before J.C. Sherritt took off on an end around for a 32 yard touchdown run. The kick was no good and the Colts led, 6-0, after one quarter.

On the next series, Wedgesworth recovered another fumble on the Les Schwab 32 yard line, but the Colts gave back the ball on a fumble of their own as the wet ball was hard to hang onto.

On the Colts' first possession of the second half, Sherritt took the ball on a broken play and raced

28 yards for the touchdown. The kick failed and the Colts led, 12-0.

On Les Schwab's next possession, Brandon Johnson stepped in front of the intended receiver and intercepted the pass, then sped 45 yards untouched for the touchdown. Kenny's kick was good for two points to give the Colts a 20-0 lead.

Peter Geer recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter to set up the Colts' final touchdown at the Les Schwab 45 yard line.

Good runs by Cody Lovgren

and Casey Maben moved the ball to the nine yard line where Cody Ford-Day took off around end and raced into the end zone for the Colts' final points.

The Colts' next game will be on Wednesday, Sept. 29 at Stanfield at 7 p.m.
