Morrow County District Attorney David C. Allen has released the following business to come before the Morrow County Circuit Court: October 7-Linda Kay Cherry was convicted of driving while suspended and sentenced to a \$125 fine. October 8-Daniel Brian Williams was convicted of Assault IV a Class A misdemeanor, and sentenced to 18 months' bench probation; 180 days in jail, suspended; fines fees and assessments of \$619 (\$500 suspended on the condition that he enroll in an anger management program); 40 hours of community service; submit to drug and alcohol evaluation and treatment if necessary; and have no contact with the victim.

Wool contest deadline nears

Make It Yourself With Wool Entry Deadline Nears
Friday, November 12, is the deadline to enter the Oregon Make It Yourself With Wool competition to be held on Saturday, December 4, at the Hilton Hotel in Eugene. Entry forms and contest information are available from Maureen Krebs, director of the Oregon Make It Yourself With Wool Contest, 69956 Highway 74 Cecil, lone, OR 97843; phone (541) 422-7548. Contest judging takes place on December 4 and culminates with a fashion show and awards ceremony in the evening. The contest is held in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Oregon Sheep Growers Association. The junior and senior division Oregon winners will receive a trip to Denver, Colorado, to compete in the National Make It Yourself With Wool Finals, January 13-15, 2000. The competition is open to anyone interested in sewing, knitting or crocheting with wool fabric and yarn. Contestants must select, construct, and model their garment made of 100 percent wool or a wool blend (minimum 60% wool).

Drug investigation

The BENT Drug Task Force arrested a Boardman man, Alex Rivera, 21, October 26 as a result of a six-month-long investigation into Rivera's "drug distribution activities" in Morrow and Umatilla counties and surrounding area. Rivera was taken into custody shortly after selling over 100 grams of methamphetamine, while under surveillance by task force members. The arrest led to a search of Rivera's Boardman residence where "additional evidence of drug sales was seized," according to the Morrow County Sheriff's Office. The methamphetamine seized in the arrest has a street value of over \$10,000, according to police. The task force also seized \$3,000 in cash as well as scales and other drug items. Rivera was charged with one count of possession of a controlled substance, one count of delivery of a controlled substance and one count of deliver of a controlled substance within 1,000 feet of a school. Rivera was lodged at the Umatilla County Jail in Pendleton. Bail was set at \$75,000.
