

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

MCSO, Oregon State Police received a request for an officer from a male subject in Irrigon who says his uncle is drunk and wouldn't leave the house.

Boardman Police Dept. received a request for an officer concerning harassing phone calls. The caller said she got the phone number from caller ID.

MCSO, Boardman Police Dept. received a report that a subject who had been harassing on the phone came to the Outback Apts. and tried to kick in the door of one of the tenants.
