Donor program to be Boardman Chamber topic

Questions and answers about organ donation and the Oregon Donor Program will be the topic at the January 19 monthly meeting of the Boardman Chamber of Commerce. The presenter will be a local resident and organ recipient.

"Many citizens and businesses are reexamining their values and life goals at the beginning of the year 2000," says a chamber spokesperson. "The decision to be an organ and tissue donor could save or improve the quality of life for as many as 75 people. The Boardman Chamber of Commerce is honored to host an educational presentation of questions and answers about organ donation for its first meeting in the year 2000."

Lisa Breckenridge of Greater Eastern Oregon Development Corporation will also address chamber members on the statewide assessment of telecommunications infrastructure as required by Senate Bill 622.

"For rural Oregon communities, telecommunications is the 'great equalizer,'" said a chamber news release. "It is critical that our community participate in the statewide assessment and register local community telecommunication needs."
