Upon graduation he accepted a teaching position at Milwaukie Junior High for five years and then spent another 12 years teaching in Portland Public Schools until 1969.

In 1962, the couple and their three children purchased a filbert orchard and began "nut farming". That was the beginning of several shared business ventures. Over the next 25 years, they owned and operated a donut shop, a wholesale food distributorship, a True Value Hardware store and real estate sales and development.

They constructed and operated a professional and retail shopping center and subdivision until 1993.

Their last and present venture is the purchase of a manufactured home park.

In between these businesses, their three children married and presented them with seven grandsons and one granddaughter, one granddaughter-in-law and one great grandson.

The Padbergs enjoy traveling and have traveled throughout the United States, Canada, Alaska, and have taken trips to Mexico, Germany, England, Scotland and Wales, a cruise from Montreal to Miami in 1998 and most recently a cruise through the Panama Canal.

In 1996 they came home to Heppner to retire and enjoy the people and community.
