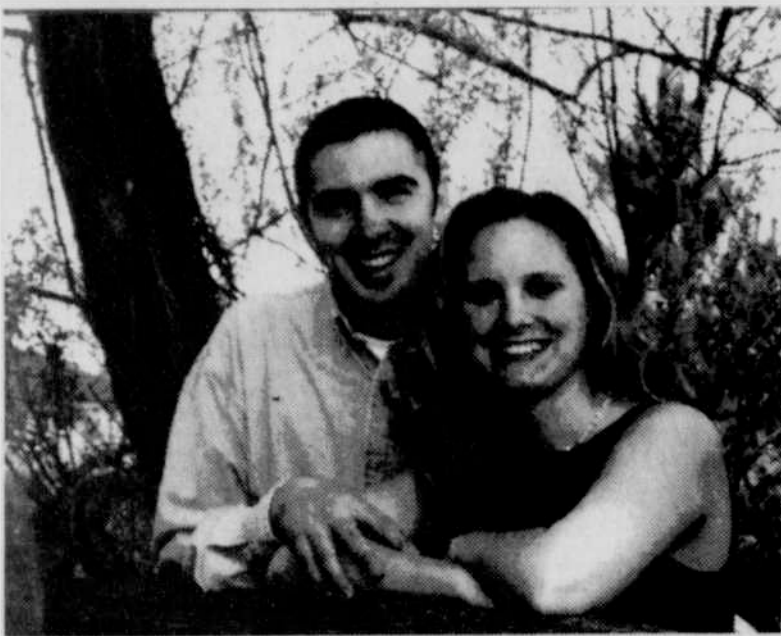


## Engagement Kemp - Joyce

Graveside service was held Tuesday, May 30, 2000 at the Heppner Masonic Cemetery.

He was born July 3, 1918, at Lexington, to Harry and Cora Gilman Munkers. He attended grade school at Lexington, then attended school in Heppner, graduating from high school in 1937.

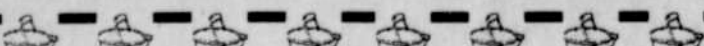
