The Academic Assembly for Heppner Elementary School was held Thursday, June 1, in the old school gymnasium. Eighty-one different students received certificates for academic contests, activities, or exceptional work in class. Traditionally at Heppner Elementary School, the final awards given are the President's Education Awards Program.

To qualify for this award, students must meet high local and national standards. Daycare shows support for local donors



Heppner Daycare has recognized Kim and Bert Houweling of Central Market and Darrell Rayer of the Bank of Eastern Oregon for their support and donations during the St. Patrick's Celebration.

The daycare center's summer hours are now in effect from 6:45 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and they have "a lot of exciting things planned for the summer," according to director Merry Brannon.

The center can accept only four children in their infant and toddler program for children six weeks to 2-1/2 years. The four children have their own care giver and each has his own crib for napping. The center has a new soft play area and new equipment is on order for age-appropriate play, says Brannon.

The day care center will be able to take children to the Willow Creek Water Park during the 1-5 p.m. swim and will also help out parents by taking children to other planned activities, such as swim lessons, Bible school or Hands On

Science, for example. Summer student care givers include Kim Pointer, Danielle McDowell and Leah Denton.

Rates are \$2.50 per hour for the first child aged three and up and \$1.75 for additional children in a family. Rates for children six

weeks to 2-1/2 years is \$3 an hour.
