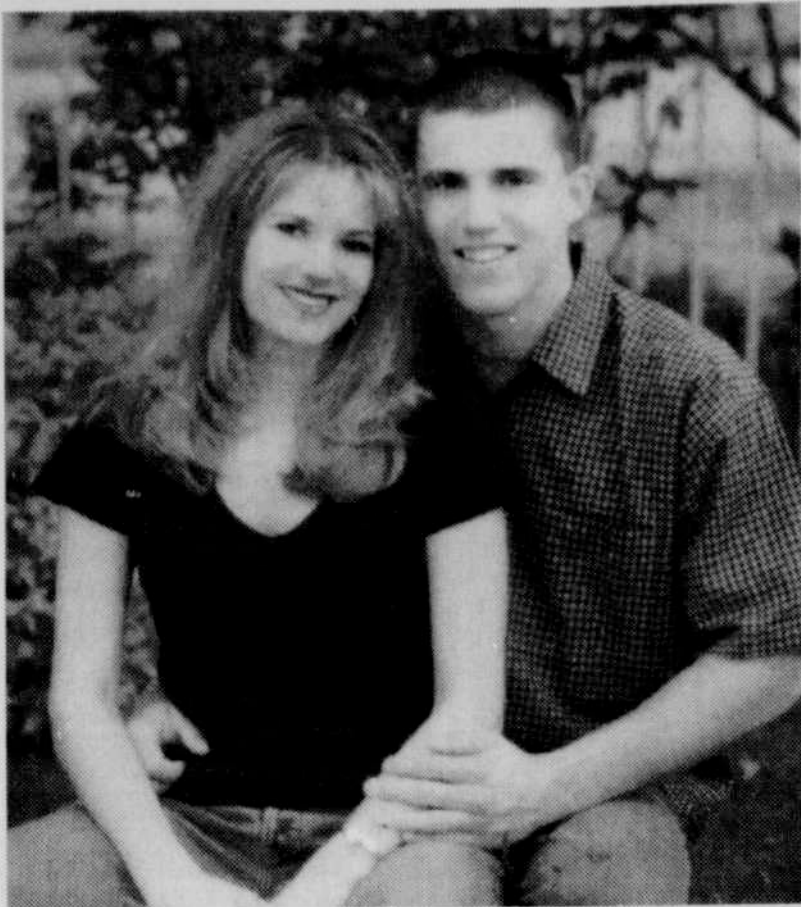


Engagement Moeller - Sarich



Lori Jean Moeller and Nicholas Emery Sarich

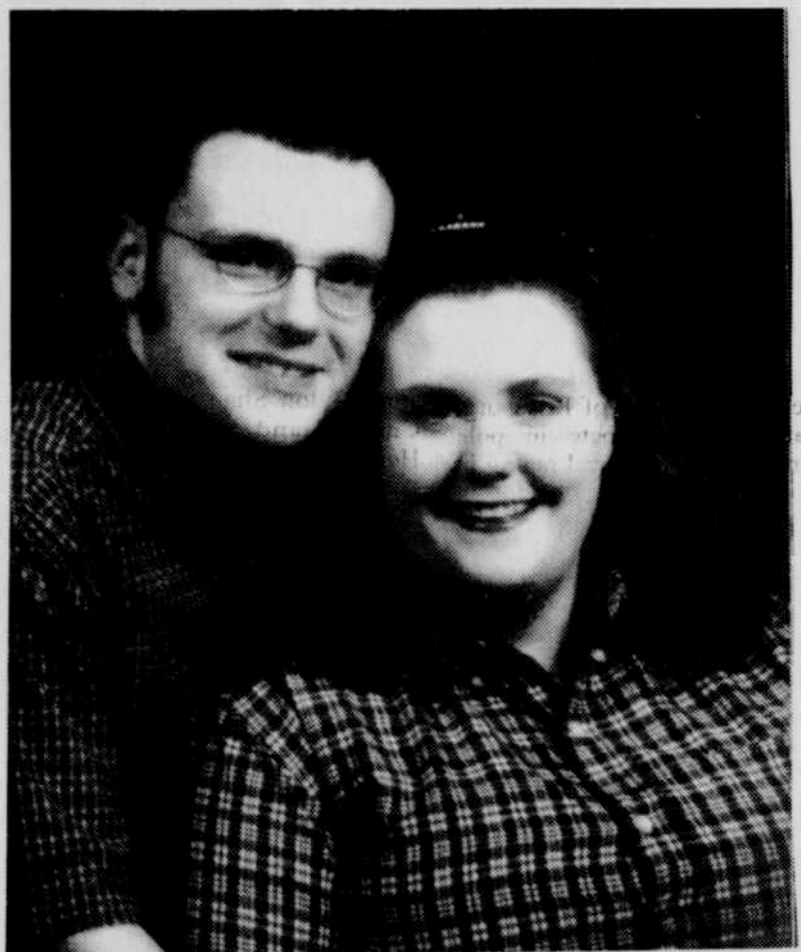
