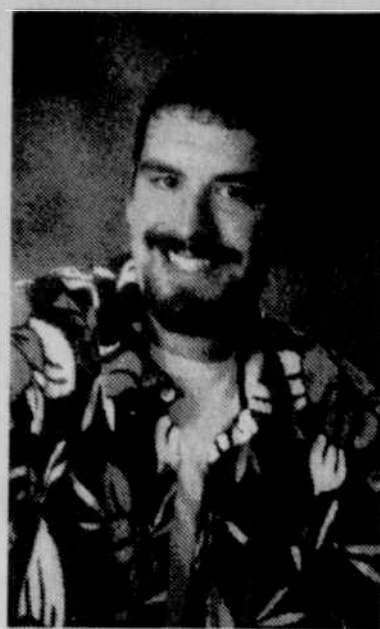
Each of these students will receive a \$500 scholarship in the fall to help them pay for tuition, books, room and board and other college expenses.

## Local student earns honor

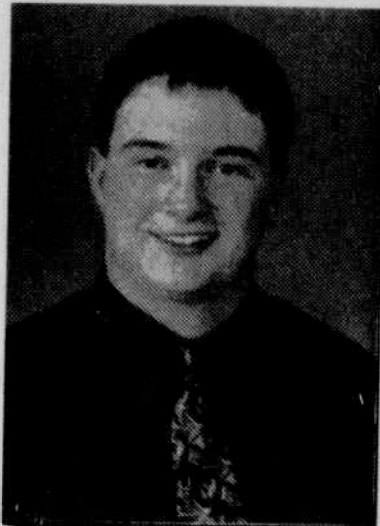
Brooke Boyer of Lexington has accepted membership in The National Society of Collegiate Scholars and will be honored during a campus ceremony this fall at Boise State University.

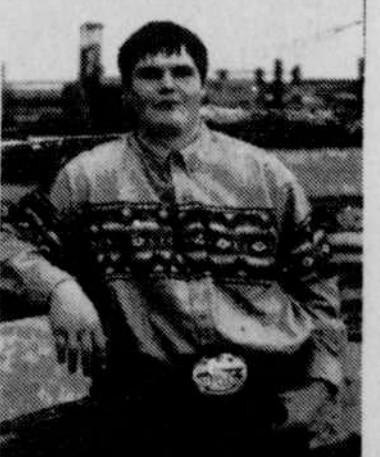

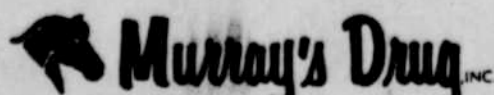
