**Harry Leland Walker, Jr.**

Harry Leland Walker, Jr., 77, of Irrigon, died Monday, September 11, 2000, at his home.

At his request no service will be held. Disposition was by cremation.

Mr. Walker was born April 15, 1923, at Briggsdale, Colorado, to Harry L. and Lucy Seivers Walker. He was raised in Colorado and joined the United States Army Air Force on January 26, 1943, serving until November 13, 1945, during World War II. After his honorable discharge, he returned to Colorado.

He married Mary Libby and the couple moved to California where Mr. Walker worked as a plumber. In 1998, after retirement, he moved to Irrigon to be near his daughter.

He was a member of the Plumbers and Steam Fitters Union Local 342.

He was preceded in death by his parents, and wife Mary. Survivors include his daughter, Cyndi Scott of Irrigon; son, Harry L. Walker III of Fremont, California; a brother, Robert Walker in California; two grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

Mary B. Causey, a long time resident of Douglas, Arizona, passed away on September 11, 2000, at Westchester Care Center in Tempe, Arizona. Mary was the sister of Kathleen M. Hisler of Heppner.

Services were held Saturday, September 16, 2000 at 10:30 a.m. at the Immaculate Conception Church of Douglas, with burial to follow at Calvary Cemetery.

Mary Causey was born September 25, 1911, in Condon. She was a graduate of St. Mary's Hospital of Nursing in Walla Walla, Washington. During World War II she served as a lieutenant in the Naval Nurses Corps at the U. S. Naval Hospital in San Diego, California. While in the coast city, she met Dr. Joseph S. Causey to whom she was married on November 25, 1944, in Astoria. Dr. Causey predeceased Mary on October 19, 1994.

In 1957, Mrs. Causey helped organize the Douglas Association for Retarded Children. She also helped establish the Maryvale School for Retarded Children that was named in her honor. She was a longtime volunteer and board member at the school.

Mrs. Causey received the Lady of the Year Award in 1962 for her outstanding civic and social work in Douglas. She was an active member of the Immaculate Conception Church and served as the president of the Altar Society in 1961.

She is survived by her daughter and son-in-law, Sandra and Thomas Sanders of Tempe; her son and daughter-in-law, Joseph and Joslyn Causey, of Phoenix; her four grandchildren: Christine Sanders of Studio City, California, Julie Sanders of Whitefish, Montana, Brent Causey of Phoenix and Jared Causey of Phoenix.
