Helix defeats Lady Cardinals

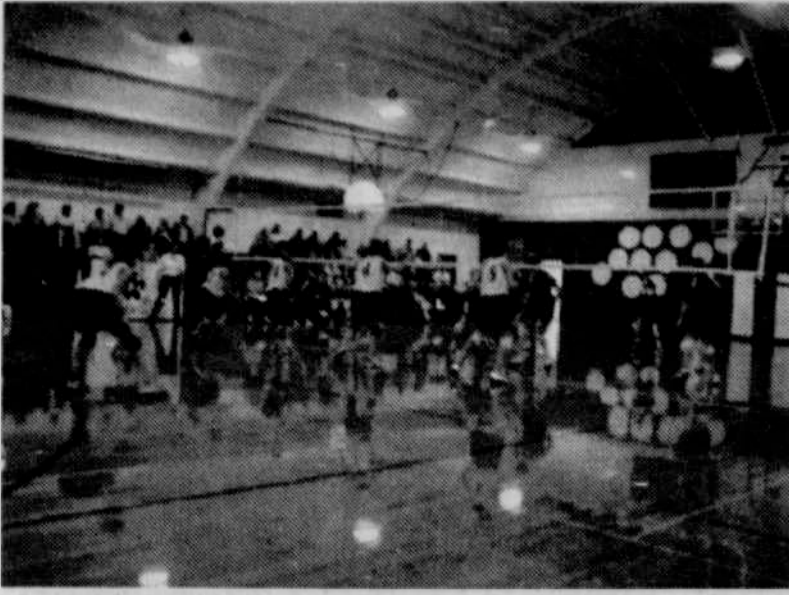

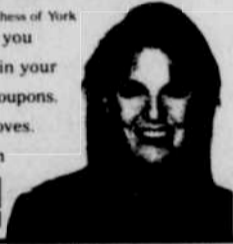
