The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

November 11: Boardman Police Department (BPD) received a report of a problem at a Boardman residence. The caller refused to give a reason for his call, said there was no dispute, it was a non-emergency and he did not want lights or sirens in response. He disconnected when questioned further.

-MCSO, BPD received a report of a male sneaking around a residence looking in the windows.

-MCSO, Irrigon Ambulance received a report from an Irrigon subject that his father was shot by his mother. It was a false report.

November 12: MCSO, BPD, Boardman Ambulance, Morrow County Behavioral Health received a report from a female calling from the Boardman westbound rest area that she was kidnapped approximately three days previously from Kelso, WA. She said that when the suspect got out of the vehicle at Bojac's to sell drugs, she got in the driver's seat and drove away. She was transported to Good Shepherd Hospital in Hermiston.

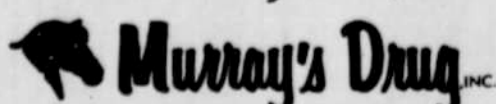
