Hands on Science scheduled

The winter session of "Hands on Science" is scheduled to begin on Friday, Feb. 9, at the Heppner Elementary School cafeteria, and at the Ione Elementary School on Saturday, Feb. 17. The Hands on Science program (HOS) is a recreational science program open to children in grades pre-K-6. The winter session will feature classes in chemistry.

The two classes will be available in Heppner will be "Chemistry Creations" for children who are in kindergarten through second grade, and "Your Own Mini Lab" for children who are in grade three-six.

"Chemistry Creations" will provide an opportunity for students to learn how to safely mix and measure. The participants will then be able to "enjoy the magic of chemical reactions that change color, liberate gases and neutralize acids and bases," said area coordinator Sarah Carlson.

The students will use chemicals and equipment similar to what is found in a kitchen to answer such questions as, "How can you use chemical reactions to identify unknowns?" This class will be held from 1-2 p.m.

In "Your Own Mini-Lab" students will set up a mini-lab by making their own test tube rack as basic equipment. These students will make cheese, glue, play putty and more. They will test the viscosity, solubility and acid/base reactions with safe ingredients only. This class will be held from 2:30 - 3:30 p.m.

Two HOS chemistry classes will be available in Ione on Saturday mornings at 10 a.m. Older students in grades two through six may register for "Your Own Mini-Lab" and younger students grades pre-kindergarten through first grade are eligible to register for "Chemistry Detectives".

In "Chemistry Detectives" students experiment with mixtures, solutions and acids and bases. The students will make glue from milk, concoct scented soap balls, bath salts and ink. The children will become science sleuths to help solve the "Gold Paper Capet".

Sarah Carlson has been involved with the HOS program since 1989 and taught junior high science in Heppner for 12 years. "The HOS program is one of the best recreational educational programs available in the United States," said Carlson. "I continue to be involved with the program

because I am continually impressed by the quality of the lessons, materials and educational experience that the students receive. Also, I have seen the positive influence it has had on the science aptitude and attitudes of the students who have continually participated in the classes," she said.

The HOS curriculum is on a three-year rotation cycle which means that the opportunity to participate in HOS chemistry classes only comes around once every three years. "The chemistry classes are very popular for a couple of reasons. First, they are fun, but second they provide an educational opportunity that just isn't available in the regular classroom," said Carlson.

The program is being made available through the Umatilla-Morrow ESD. There is a \$45 registration fee. "This fee enables the students to come to class with nothing and leave with lots of stuff so they can repeat the experiments at home. Do not let the registration fee be the determining factor in your child's participation. Scholarships are available," says Carlson.

There are eight classes in a session. The Heppner classes will meet on non-school Fridays with the eighth and final class on April 13. The Ione classes will meet on Saturdays with the last class on April 14. Registration forms are available in the Heppner and Ione Public Libraries, Post Offices and school offices. Preregistration is important and necessary to know that there is enough interest to hold the classes.
