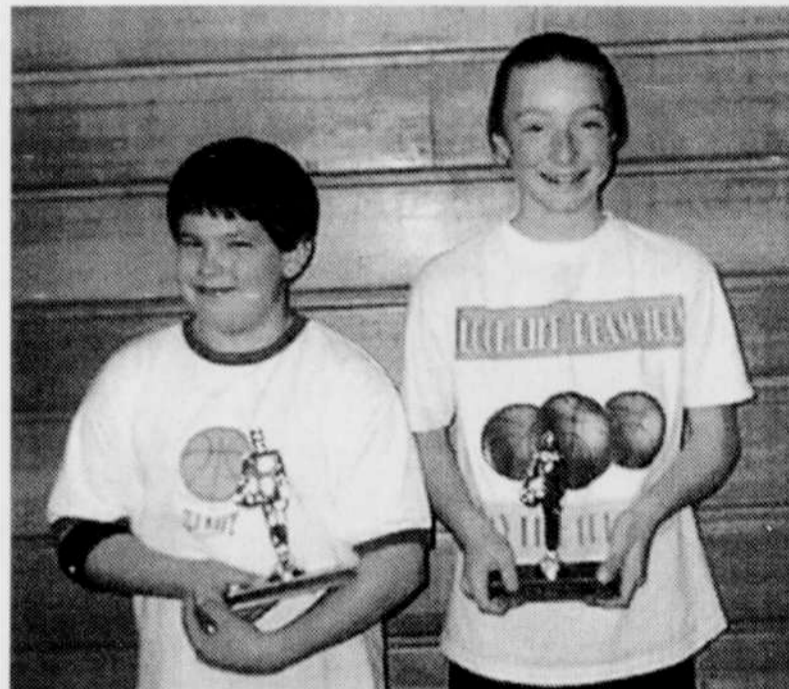
Boardman Chamber new board

Morrow County District Attorney David C. Allen has released the following report:

George Michael Coover plead guilty to false application of resident bear tag. He was sentenced to 24 months' bench probation and ordered to not hunt or angle within the state of Oregon for two years and pay \$364 in fines and assessments.

Charles Eugene VanGorder, III, plead guilty to Assault IV. He was sentenced to incarceration with the local supervisory authority for Morrow County for 90 days, suspended on the condition that he complete 18 months' probation, have no offensive physical contact with the victims, perform 80 hours community service, complete anger management and alcohol packages and pay \$684 in fines, fees and assessments.
