Examination of school rating system

To the Editor:

The Morrow County School Superintendent's Office has issued its reading of the state's annual report of each of our schools in the district. As the school board's report created headlines in the Heppner Gazette-Times, an examination of the rating system is warranted by all persons in the county who are concerned about the quality of the curriculum offered. The Oregon Department of Education, to help us understand how the state reaches the assessments, distributes a video.

The state's report relates to progress made in various aspects of school improvement efforts. A "satisfactory" or "excellent" score only on improvement does not mean we are meeting state standards.

For instance, the reading test results reflect that the following percentages of students are not meeting the state standards:
Heppner Ione State Average
Third Grade 22% 25% 18%
Fifth Grade 33% 25% 27%
Eighth Grade 47% 20% 36%
